Communication Channels

Please may we take this opportunity to revisit communication channels in school.

Clear and timely communication between home and school is vital for your child's success and well-being. This guide outlines the available channels and procedures to ensure your questions and concerns are addressed efficiently. We encourage parents/carers to use the following methods to communicate with school staff. We will always endeavor to reply at the earliest instance.

To ensure that your concerns are handled quickly and by the most appropriate member of staff, please follow this staged procedure:

Step 1: Class Teacher

All initial concerns should be raised directly with your child's Class Teacher. Such as short updates to provide information about anything that may immediately affect the well-being, behaviour, or learning of your child.

Step 2: Key Stage Leader

If the issue is not able to be resolved by the class teacher, the next step is to contact the relevant Key Stage Leader.

- Key Stage 1 (KS1) and Early Years (EY): Miss Darby
- Key Stage 2 (KS2): Mr Selkirk

Step 3: Senior Leaders

If the Key Stage Leader has been unable to resolve the issue, please contact the Assistant Headteacher, Mrs. Davies

Step 4:

If your concern has not been resolved following this process, please direct your communication to either Mrs Bateman (Gawthorpe Head of School) or Mrs Berry (Executive Headteacher).

Support from Our Learning Mentor

Our Learning Mentor, Miss Croisdale, is an essential point of contact for specific, sensitive issues. You can contact Miss Croisdale directly for:

- Discussion of any safeguarding concerns.
- Information regarding safeguarding for both parents and children.
- Assistance with accessing community support such as food vouchers or food banks.

Following these channels and procedures is helpful and appropriate because ilt ensures your concern goes directly to the staff member who has the most direct knowledge and responsibility for that specific area. By directing concerns
